VACANCY FOR PARISH COUNCILLOR

Notice of a vacancy for a Parish Councillor has been advised to SKDC, details of which have been posted on the Parish Notice Board. A by-election to fill the vacancy will be held if, within 14 working days from 16 November, ten electors give notice in writing claiming such an election to the Returning Officer. If no such notice is given, the Parish Council will fill the vacancy by co-option.

If you are interested in becoming a Co-opted Member of the Parish Council please contact any Parish Councillor who will be pleased to tell you what is involved.

PLANNING

ROAD CLOSURES

Details of alternative routes are posted on the Village Notice Board:

 The B1177 will be CLOSED just to the south of Rippingale Fen crossroads.
 Road diversion signs will be in place on the B1177, A52 and A15.

RUBBISH COLLECTION

- All residents should have received a letter from SKDC notifying the supply of Wheelie bins" in the near future. Please note the Assisted Collection Scheme number [01476] 406360 for your use if you anticipate difficulties in using the new collection system.
- The Parish Council has reported two problems regarding refuse collection to SKDC:
 - a) Bank Holiday Saturday collection in Pinfold Close, whereby the freighter could not get through parked cars. SKDC reply "... Unfortunately we are unable to make a special arrangement on Bank Holidays. ... Due to the design of our rounds no other vehicle is in the area with capacity to make these collections until the following Monday. One solution would be for the residents of this area to not have a collection until the following Monday. This would be for the Parish Council to discuss with them. Another possibility would be for the residents to place their rubbish at the end of the Close, at the junctions of Middle Street or Station Street. Again, this will rely on the good will of these residents, and the Parish council discussing this with them."

 If Pinfold Close residents would like to take up either of SKDC suggestions above, would they please contact the Clerk [440200]. Residents will then be consulted regarding future collection arrangements.
 - b) The second problem reported was that of the green Wheelie bin collection freighter leaking smelly liquid waste. SKDC reply "With regard to the collection vehicle, this vehicle is cleaned each day after use and therefore any liquid from the vehicle the following day should be clean. I apologise that this has not been the case in the past and the operations team have been instructed to monitor this more carefully in the future..."

FINANCE

The Parish Council approved expenditure of £758 to cut down hedging to rear of tennis court. The Annual Precept 2007-8 was approved at the meeting and it was agreed that a Precept of £14,000 be set, represented by a charge of £39.83 per Band "D" household. [Current charge is £36.99]. A copy of the Council Budget 2007-8 is posted on the Village Notice Board and website. DATES OF COUNCIL MEETINGS
