

Fly-Posting and Unauthorised Advertisements.

At a meeting of Rippingale Parish Council held on 11th July, 2013, a Policy on Dealing with Fly-Posting & Unauthorised Advertisements was adopted. The full Policy Document is available, upon request, from The Clerk, or to view on the village website.

"... It is an offence for any person to display an advertisement in contravention of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 2007 (Section 224, Town & Country Planning Act 1990).

It is also an offence for any person to paint or in any way inscribe or affix a picture, letter or sign on the surface of a Highway, any tree or structure without consent of the Highway Authority ...

PARISH COUNCIL RESPONSE TO FLY-POSTING & UNAUTHORISED ADVERTISMENTS.

The Parish Council will remove posters etc from Parish Council owned street furniture and buildings as soon as possible. Householders and land owners are expected to comply with planning regulations when displaying signs or any other type of advertisements on their property or land. Property owners are expected to take responsibility if fly posting occurs on their property or land.

CHARITY & COMMUNITY GROUP ADVERTISING: The Parish Council appreciates the need for LOCAL charity and community groups to advertise their events and suggests that organisers contact Lincolnshire County Council (www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/highways, 01522 782070) or South Kesteven District Council (customerservices@southkesteven.gov.uk, 01476 406080) for advice on how to advertise legally.

GENERAL GUIDANCE

- Sports Events advertisers to meet the Controlled Advertisement Regulations 2007
- Charity Events/Happy Birthday Sign to be removed the following day.
- Tributes to be removed when obviously decayed.
- Lost dogs, cats, other pets should be removed after one week.



1. PPI PAYMENT PROTECTION INSURANCE SCAM ALERT

Message sent by Community Safety Officer, Police Headquarters.

".. telephone calls are again being made to the Lincolnshire region regarding a PPI Scam.

A member of the public receives a telephone call stating that they are entitled to reclaim Payment Protection Insurance. They are assured that they ARE entitled to the sum quoted and in order for the company to issue the repayment they need to obtain UKASH vouchers to pay the company's admin. fee to release the full sum. Please DO NOT MAKE ANY PAYMENTS to companies who haven't given written paperwork or proof detailing the banks who are due to make the refund to you.

You are able to reclaim PPI yourself and DO NOT NEED to pay fees to third party organisations.

2. DOOR TO DOOR SELLERS, BOURNE AREA.

... a female going from door to door attempting to sell pencil drawings to occupants (Bourne area). This female is one of several people in the county – all of whom are producing a laminated card stating that they are deaf, and trying to earn some money to pay for their schooling.

... the female did not have a pedlar's licence and for this reason the drawings were taken from her. We would like to remind members of our community that it is your choice whether or not you wish to open the door to cold callers, and that you are not obliged to buy anything from them. Please make use of door chains and peepholes if you are uncomfortable about opening your door to strangers. We can also provide "No Cold Callers" stickers (free), which are available from Bourne Police Station.

3. MOTOR CYCLISTS & CAR DRIVERS. (30th July)

In recent months we have suffered the loss of 2 motorcyclists (Fatals) and the serious injury of a third in collisions that were clearly avoidable. Riders in all cases had attempted to overtake traffic that was behind a vehicle turning right. As the lead vehicle turned, the rider collided with it. Signs and road markings were all in evidence that the junction was ahead, all the riders had a vast amount of experience but still chose to try and make the overtake.

Motor Cyclists - look at your behaviour, look at your overtakes, are they risk assessed or just risky? Car drivers – please check your mirrors before turning right and signal your intention.

The last person you overtake will be the first witness at your crash scene!

There will be more fatalities – just don't be the next number!.

RIPPINGALE FEAST

The notion of re-instating the Village feast moved into reality this year.

With a series of lead up mini events, there could not have been anyone in the village who did not know what was taking place on the Feast Weekend of 20/21st July.

Saturday saw "Erection Day" where villagers were invited to help put up marquees and prepare the Jubilee Playing Field for the big day. A great atmosphere prevailed, new friendships were struck and a plentiful supply of bacon rolls and cups of tea made sure preparations were completed with plenty of time to freshen up for Saturday night's Feast Ceilidh.

Final arrangements were put in place on Sunday morning and at midday a quarter peal rang out from the belfry of St Andrew's Church to announce the beginning of **THE FEAST!**

The grand parade of classic cars, scouts, motorbikes and Morris dancers, led by Rose Queen Niamh Warcup in her dad's motorcycle and sidecar, set off through the village. More and more people joined the procession as it wound its way to the Jubilee Playing Field.

As the cars turned onto the field, one of the passengers, seeing the layout for the first time, was heard to comment, "This is a real village show!"

Special guest, Martin Hill OBE, leader of Lincolnshire County Council opened The Feast and, after crowning the Rose Queen spent the afternoon sampling all that was on offer.

People brought picnics and there were, games, competitions, refreshments, a dog agility display and fine weather.

The afternoon was completed with an emotional flypast of Lincolnshire's own Lancaster Bomber and Spitfire. The planes flew over the field three times, low enough for the pilot to be seen waving to the crowd. A final salute from the Lancaster, as it sped back to base, generated a rousing cheer from the ground and as many handkerchiefs were used to wipe away tears as were used to wave goodbye!

The Feast had begun outside St Andrew's Church and it ended inside the church itself with a special Feast Songs of Praise where a large congregation saw Parish Council Chairman, Mike Hallas, present our Rose Queen with a silver rose bowl.

After the service, an unexpected refreshment table of Pimms and canapés finished off a memorable Feast Day.

Monday was a working day for most people but those who were available, turned up, once again, at the field to dismantle tents and store away all the paraphernalia. By five o'clock, after a day of blistering sunshine, there was nothing left to give clue as to the weekend's fun.

The Feast was a true community event and my thanks go to everyone in the village for making it such a success. There have been an overwhelming number of favourable comments about the weekend with a very strong plea for the Feast to be continued.

At the outset, we said that any money raised would be earmarked for improving the Feast year upon year.

There is, now, a healthy bank balance and plans are already being made for RIPPINGALE FEAST to take place on the weekend of Saturday 19th & Sunday 20th July 2014.
