

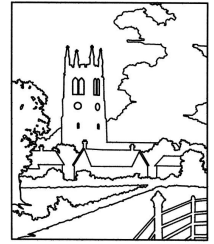

Village History- An Archive.

The 100year anniversary of WWI has caused many of us to pause and think about our personal and local histories. Some families have lived in Rippingale for generations and they have been joined over the years by many of us "newcomers" who have chosen to live in this lovely village. The popularity of the village walks show the interest there is in our local history, and our appreciation of the "Local Knowledge" that gets passed on. It would be good if we could preserve as much of this local knowledge and information as possible. This is a request/suggestion that if anyone has local papers or artefacts that they would like to be kept safely for future generations to enjoy or learn from, to please contact the Clerk.

What we could do with such items obviously depends on what comes forward – but the village could have a treasure trove that would be preserved safely and securely. Perhaps this could be a Rippingale Community project – where the older (in terms of years living here!) and newer members of the village together could create a unique archive or museum?

As Clerk, I am particularly interested in gathering together old Parish records – I wonder if in someone's attic are the old Minutes of Meetings and other documents that would fill in gaps in our archived records? Planning Applications and Decisions:

1. (1690) Change of use of agricultural land to garden land, Cardyke Barns, Fen Road, PE10 0TG – Approved, SKDC.
2. (1894) Cleaning of Stone War Memorial – Listed Building Consent – Pending.
3. (1848) Demolition of Outbuildings and erection of 2xDwellings with detached garages and provision of garage to existing dwelling, 71 Station Street, Rippingale. SKDC advised access to site concerns, no material objections to the application.
4. (1747) Change of use from Doctor's Surgery (D1) to Dwelling house (C3) and insertion of 2 roof lights. Received 11.08.14 – papers in circulation.

Individual Electoral Registration (IER)

SKDC asks the Council's help in making residents aware of the way the voters' register has changed – everyone registers to vote individually, rather than by household. Letters are being sent to all registered electors advising if they need to take further action. Anyone applying to be registered will now need to provide their National Insurance Number and date of birth.

"Vitalise" Essential Breaks for Disabled People and Carers.

This national charity has been providing respite breaks for people with disabilities and carers for over 50years – but estimates that they are reaching only 1% of the people who may require their services. In the whole of Lincolnshire only 16 families
