

- 3. (0828) RETROSPECTIVE: Continued use as garage & vehicle dismantling facility; The Workshop, Main Road, PE10 OSP. No objections raised, SKDC notified.

MAINTENANCE MATTERS:

1. Grassed area junction Pinfold Close/Middle Street.

The Parish Council has reached an agreement with the land owner (Flogas Ltd.) to take over the grass cutting of the area. The existing shrubbery is currently being removed and the site made good.

2. Allotment Access (bottom gate) from Station Street.

Tenders are being sought to carry out the repairs to this area which must comply with Highways Act 1980: Chapter 66, Section 184 – Vehicle Access Crossings to Maintainable Carriageways.

He flew into Katmandu, and then drove onwards towards the Tibet border, distributing some of the money he'd raised, before he left, to homeless and starving people. He was then caught in the middle of the second disastrous earthquake.
