

The Aims and Objectives of Rippingale Parish Council:-

"To provide services for and manage and maintain the assets of the village of Rippingale, within the law, and the resources provided by the annual precept and other incomes, taking into account the wishes of the residents and obtaining value for money."



Rippingale Community Public Access Defibrillator.

Community Public Access Defibrillators (CPAD) are becoming a common sight on many British streets and in places of work. In rural communities they are a vital piece of equipment that can improve the statistics of surviving a cardiac arrest from less than 3% to around 50% so long as they are used quickly.

Final planning for the activation of the Rippingale CPAD is well underway and, once the Defibsafe is fitted at the proposed Village Hall site, the defibrillator will become available for use in the case of a cardiac arrest within the village.

We are now able to offer the first sessions to teach basic life support skills and how to use the defibrillator in the community. This training will take around two hours to complete and is open to anyone. We hope that we can encourage as many people as possible to learn the principles of resuscitation and how to use the defibrillator, and create a community of life savers in the process.

The first FREE training sessions will be held in the Village Hall on Saturday 12th December 2015 between 10am - 12pm and 2pm – 4pm.

There are a maximum of 12 places in each session.

The sessions will be led by Nigel Adams and Erica Field-Lucas, both of whom are accredited CPR and AED trainers. Nigel currently works with the LIVES service and Erica has 30 years' nursing experience.

RIPPINGALE OIL CONSORTIUM

Oil price comparisons are usually posted on the village website the same day that Chandlers publish them, sometimes [but no always] within minutes of them being sent out. Chandlers E-mail out to subscribing customers, the delivery price a day or so before the start of the group deliveries and the Members who have placed an order with Chandlers can cancel and place an order with a cheaper supplier if they wish, providing they contact Chandlers straight away. So do go on line and check before your next delivery.
